MAYOR'S CORNER — A FEW RANDOM THOUGHTS

ne of the benefits of being Mayor of Bountiful City is that I have the opportunity to rub shoulders with so many of our outstanding citizens. Whether it's at the grocery store, a restaurant, a community event, at church, or simply on the street, Bountiful's residents are not shy about expressing their thoughts and opinions. I love talking to them, because it gives me the opportunity to get their thoughts and feeling about things which we are do-

ing well, and things that we may need to improve on as we go forward.

The filing deadline for municipal elections ended on July 15th. We have six candidates who have filed for three council seats. The election will be held on November 8, 2011. The three incumbent council members, all of whom are completing their first full four year term, have filed for reelection - Councilman Scott Myers, Councilwoman Beth Holbrook, and Councilman John Marc Knight. One former City Councilman, Richard Higginson, has also filed to run, along with Ernie Cox, who has run previously, and Micah Day, a young person who I had the opportunity to meet a

couple of weeks ago. The three candidates receiving the most votes on November 8, 2011, will take office to serve a four-year term beginning January, 2012. I believe the three incumbent council members have done an outstanding job in their first four-year term and deserve serious consideration for a second fouryear term. By the same token, the other three candidates are good people whose intent appears to be to keep Bountiful the special place that it is. I would encourage all citizens to get to know the council candidates a little better between now and November

I want to thank all of the citizens and businesses of the community for their preparation, communication and understanding of our power outage in June. It was absolutely amazing how few calls we received during the outage, which we scheduled for a Sunday morning at 1:00 a.m. The changes that we needed to make to our main substation were successfully completed and the citizens' preparation and understanding of this even could not have been better (see related story on page 3). We are also continuing to progress on our power plant expansion at 200 West, and hope to take delivery of the new natural gas turbines by December, 2011, so they will be installed and ready to operate for the summer time

electrical load in 2012.

For those of you who have not had an opportunity to attend a play at the new Centerpoint Legacy Theater, I would encourage you to do so. The quality of the plays is outstanding, the facility is first-rate, and the entertainment is wholesome and family-oriented. I am proud that Bountiful partnered with Centerville City to complete this exceptional addition to the cultural life of South Davis County.

I also want to report to you that the South Davis Recreation Center is continuing to be a great success. Our citizens, ranging from tots to our oldest seniors, use and enjoy the facil-

ity. Being active throughout your life is a blessing. Financially, the center is doing well and has exceeded the revenue projections made when it was constructed. The admission rate and annual fees are almost identical to when it opened five years ago, and we have not had to ask for any tax increase to support the facility. If you haven't had the chance or taken the opportunity to visit the facility, I would encourage you to do so.

Finally, congratulations to our 2010-11 Bountiful Youth City Council, awarded First Place for the best youth city council in the state. Thanks to Councilman Knight for being their advisor.

Being Mayor of Bountiful is one of the best jobs in the world. I have enjoyed my almost 10 years as Mayor, and look forward to the remainder of my term serving the citizens of Bountiful.

BOUNTIFUL CITY'S FALL CLEAN UP

all cleanup is October 10 thru October 14, 2011. During that week city crews on your regular garbage pickup day will also remove trash and refuse which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed. Limbs and trees must be cut, bundled and *tied* in 5-foot lengths. Any bundles, bags or boxes must not exceed 50 lbs. Items such as old furniture or

appliances should be placed on the drive approach or park strip, not on the street or sidewalk. Please place your items out by 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day.

We can no longer accept propane tanks or tires of any kind during clean up week or at the landfill.

Garbage is picked up on all holidays except for Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years Day. On those three holidays your garbage will be one day delayed with Friday's route being picked up on Saturday. Again, please have your containers out by 7:00 a.m. on garbage day.


