regular basis. You can follow them on Instagram (bountifuldavisartcenter) or Facebook (@BDAC1).


And while you are downtown on Main Street there are delicious food choices, and fun, unique places to shop!

very March our community partners with local Cub and Boy Every March our community parties with some 2019 Scouting for Scouts on the Scouting for Food Drive. The 2019 Scouting for Food Drive, with participation from North Salt Lake to Farmington, resulted in the donation of 118,543,165 pounds of food for the Bountiful Community Food Pantry. The Pantry is very appreciative of these donations and the time and effort put into this day by our local scouting organizations.



If you missed the opportunity to donate food in March you will have the opportunity again on May 11 with the Stamping Out Hunger Food Drive. You can also bring food donations to the food pantry Monday - Saturday mornings or Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings. In March 2019, the Bountiful Community Food Pantry provided food assistance 10,702 times for individuals in Davis County which includes helping 1,987 children weekly who attend 66 different schools in Davis County. Special Dates at the Bountiful City Cemetery

he Memorial Day holiday is our favorite time of the vear at the Cemetery. With lots of preparation and extra hard work, the Cemetery will be ready for those who quietly come by themselves to pay their respects as well as for large groups that come with chairs and blankets to spend the day visiting with friends and family honoring loved ones.

In order for the Cemetery staff to have the grounds ready for the big holiday, please be aware of the following dates: Monday, May 6: Regular monthly cleanup date. Everything that is ground-level will get cleaned up. If you are bringing flowers for Mother's Day on May 12, please wait until after May 6.

Thursday, May 16 - Wednesday, May 22: Except for funeral services, no flowers or decorations are allowed on cemetery grounds during these seven days. This gives the workers the ability to do some extra mowing, edging and other preparations without having things in their way. Because Memorial Day is early this year, that puts the clean-up date only four days after Mother's Day. If you bring items for Mother's Day that you want to keep, be sure to come back soon after the holiday to retrieve those

Thursday, May 23 - Sunday June 2: Flowers and decorations are allowed! Monday, June 2: Regular monthly cleanup date. Everything that is ground level is

cleaned up. We appreciate all the Scouts and volunteers who help us with this **HUGE** project!

Even if you don't usually visit the Cemetery, you might want to drive by to the see all the flowers left in remembrance of those who have gone before. It's beautiful!





Magic on the Sidewalk Chalk Art Festival—May 15-18—Main Street



Music in the Park starts June 21—City Park


