Mayor's Corner: Bountiful's Youth Council!

id you know Bountiful City has an award-winning Youth Council? Known at City Hall as the BCYC, the Bountiful City Youth Council is a service organization that teaches Bountiful youth the principles of responsible government and community service in both formal and social settings. The BCYC provides many rewarding opportunities for its members. This past year, members participated in the Handcart Days Parade, helped with Summerfest, learned first hand about city and state governments through participating in a Day at the Legislature, completed over a dozen City-wide service projects, sponsored the Halloween "Pumpkin Patch" and the Easter egg hunt "Bunny Hop" for elementary-aged children in the community and

generally had a great time accomplishing all that they did!

Applications to participate on the BCYC are accepted at City Hall annually in April. The application is posted on the Bountiful City website, the BCYC website (www.bcycouncil.org) and social media (Facebook, Instagram and Twitter) around the first of April each year. The application process includes completing the application and an interview with the adult BCYC advisors and the BCYC youth leadership. The application is for the following school year and once on the BCYC, the applicant stays until graduation from high school as long they are actively participating on the Council.

Qualifications to be on the BCYC include having at least a 3.0 grade point average, be a high



school student (9th-12th grades) for the following school year and be a resident of Bountiful City. BCYC meets weekly at Bountiful City Hall, and requires additional time to carry out the activities they are involved in and plan as well.

If you are or a student you know might be interested in participating on the BCYC, watch the City's website and/or social media next spring for information and a link to the application. It's a great organization that's worth the time spent and friendships made! You won't regret it!

very March our community partners with local Cub and Boy Scouts on the Scouting for Food Drive. The 2018 Scouting for Food Drive, with participation from North Salt Lake to Farmington, resulted in the donation of 113,165 pounds of food for the Bountiful Community Food Pantry. The Pantry is very appreciative of these generous donations and the time and effort put into this day by our local scouting organizations.


