Mayor's Corner: Bountiful's Parks

B ountiful has 16 parks totaling nearly 100 acres of open green space for our residents to enjoy with family, friends and neighbors. The newest park, Creekside has been very well received—lots of five star ratings online! If you haven't visited the park yet, we hope you will be able to soon!

Park Reservations

Did you know you can reserve pavilions at five of the City parks for events or gatherings? Reservation "season" is April 15-October 15 and reservations are taken in person at City Hall beginning the first working Monday of the year for that year. There is a fee to reserve the pavilion and they can be reserved for morning (9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.), afternoon (4:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.) or all day.

Most of our parks have bowerys—the largest bowery holds 250 people and the smallest 15,

and most have public restrooms and picnic tables. Those bowerys that are not reservable can be used on a first-come-firstserved basis. Bountiful City Park has a stage and North Canyon Park has an amphitheater. Bountiful's parks have (not at all locations) playgrounds, pickle ball, basketball, volleyball and tennis courts, walking/ jogging trails, water features, soccer fields, drinking fountains, power and even two slack lines at Creekside Park! Dogs on Leash

Bountiful City's Fall Clean Up

all clean up week is October 8-12. During that week on your regular garbage pickup day, City crews will also remove trash and refuse which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed in addition to the regular pick up. Limbs and trees must be cut in five foot lengths, bundled and tied with twine. Each bundle, bag or box must not exceed 50 pounds. Please separate metal items from your other debris as metal recycling crews will be picking up those items. Concrete and construction materials will not be picked up curb side. All items including old furniture or appliances must be placed on the drive approach or park strip, not on the street or sidewalk. Fall clean up items will be picked up by several special clean up crews and they may come at different

times or days than your regular garbage collection. Different crews will be picking up different types of items. All of your clean up items may not be picked up at the same time. Please have your clean up items out for our crews to pick up before 7:00 a.m. on your regular garbage dav.

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Also, to assist you in your clean up, the landfill will not charge Bountiful residents a fee during fall clean up week or the following week (October 15-20-proof

How Do I Prepare For Disasters?

here seems to be a ▲ lot of disasters in the world right nowfires, evacuations, etc. How do you prepare for them? One

COMMUNITY EMERGEN way is with Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training. CERT teaches you medical skills, how to put out fires, how to easily lift heavy objects with simple tools, and how to recognize and protect yourself from terrorist attacks and hazardous material inci-

CERT training is open to anyone, but minors must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Many families

take the course and enjoy learning and practicing together. This training is valuable for everyone, but it is especially important for Block Captains to take it.

The class meets one evening per week for nine weeks with a final mock disaster on a Saturday morning. The cost for the course is \$45, which pays for your CERT gear (backpack, vest, helmet, googles, dust mask, flashlight, pry bar, gloves and CERT manual) which is yours to keep. You can take either the Tuesday or the Thursday class and the next session starts September 11 or 13. Don't wait until the class is full or until disaster strikes! HOLIDAY GARBAGE & RECYCLING PICKUP

Garbage and recycling are picked up on all holidays except for Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day. On Thanksgiving, Thursday's garbage will be picked up on Friday and Friday's garbage will be picked up on Saturday. The Christmas and New Year's holidays fall on Tuesday this season, so garbage and recycling pickup will be picked up on Christmas and New Year's Eve (Monday) and then delayed by one day the rest of that week starting with Tuesday's pick up which will be picked up on Wednesday, Wednesday on Thursday, Thursday on Friday and Friday on Saturday. Please place your cans out by 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day.

FALL LEAF PICK UP

As autumn approaches, Bountiful City crews will be looking for leaves to pick up from your park strip. If possible, please bag your leaves so they won't be blown away. There is no need to call the City to schedule a pick up unless the leaves/bags have been set out for a week or more. This is an extra service the

City provides until the trucks need to be made ready to plow for our winter storms.

Bountiful City Light & Power Update

Bountiful City Light & Power (BCLP) has successfully completed the first phase of the \$6 million total rebuild of our 138 KV substation located west of Legacy Highway in Centerville. This substation was originally built in 1966 and is the sole source of electricity to supply power to the *entire* city.

In anticipation of future power needs for Bountiful City, BCLP worked with PacifiCorp in 2010-11 to allow the installation of a second breaker or feed into the City. For the past three years, BCLP has been planning, budgeting for and designing the first phase of the rebuild. During the last 16 months, working on the installation has been a day-to-day project. The timing was recently accelerated due to an oil test indicating that one of the original transformers was developing an internal breakdown.

All existing structures, equipment, and concrete on the north bay of the substation were removed and the bay has been completely rebuilt. A new 100 MVA (million volt amps which is equal to 10,000 100 watt light bulbs) power transformer has been installed, and a new control building was constructed with all new relays for the new substation. This work was completed inside of the energized substation while continuing to supply power to the City.

The second phase is scheduled to begin in September. Removal of and rebuilding the south bay of the substation should be completed by the end of this year. The new substation will have all new equipment, structures, and two new 100 MVA transformers which are large enough that either one could carry the whole City over the summer peak.

Pay your sewer bill electronically

F or the convenience of our customers, the South Davis Sewer District has two options to pay the semi-annual billing in January and July.

- 1. **ACH DIRECT PAYMENT**: This option automatically withdraws the semi-annual payment from the customer's checking account. The customer can receive an email statement and/or a paper bill. The notice will include a reminder that an ACH payment will be processed.
- BANK BILL PAY: Most banks offer this service. The bank will send the payment to the District. If this option is utilized, be sure to include the -00 or 00 on the end of your District account number so your account can be found electronically. The District account number stays with the property and is not transferred if a customer moves to a different location within the District. If a customer
