**1. Why have you submitted your name for consideration?**

I've submitted my name because I see it as an opportunity to serve the public and contribute to the work our local government does for the community where I grew up, raised my family, and continue to call home. 6. **List relevant work experience that you believe would help you fill the role of city council member.**

As a paralegal, I understand how the law works and how decisions move through legislative bodies. I am retired from the Davis School District's Office of Policy and School Law, where I wrote, managed, and updated District policy. This role required closely tracking federal and state legislation as well as State Board of Education rules, and helping District leadership understand the practical implications of those changes. I worked directly with the locally elected Board of Education during the policy adoption process to ensure policies were clear, workable, and legally sound. I also helped train administrators on what these changes meant for students, families, and staff, and how to implement them in a practical, thoughtful way. I continue to work with the District as a part-time policy consultant, primarily during the State legislative session.

Beyond policy work, I've planned and managed large projects, events, and conferences, which taught me to juggle competing priorities, collaborate across departments, and follow through—skills I would bring to the city council.
