#### MEMORIAL DAY AT BOUNTIFUL CITY CEMETERY

Visiting the graves of our loved ones during the Memorial Day holiday is a time-honored tradition in our area. At the Bountiful City Cemetery, most graves are visited, and many are completely covered with flowers brought by friends and family. Cemetery staff are already

working and preparing the grounds for the holiday weekend. Visitors, please be aware of the following dates:

Friday May 15<sup>th</sup> through Wednesday, (the week *prior* to Memorial Day): May 20<sup>th</sup> In order to help with last-minute mani-



curing of the cemetery, all ground-level decora-tions will be cleaned up. Please do not deliver flowers or decorations to the cemetery prior to <u>Thursday</u>, <u>May 21<sup>st</sup></u>.

Monday, June 1<sup>st</sup> - (the Monday after Memorial Day): Please pick up any flowers or decorations you want to save before that date. Remember: It's illegal to take anything off a grave you do not own!

We hope you'll have a chance to drive through and enjoy the beauty of the cemetery during the holiday weekend.



cross connection—which is illegal—is any actual A or potential arrangement between a public or a consumer culinary water system, and any other source or system that may potentially introduce any chemicals, fertilizers, or untreated water into the public drinking water system. Cross connections should be avoided as they can contaminate the public drinking water supply.

Also—please remember that watering re-

strictions are, and always will be, in place for out-door watering between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Watering during these hours is not very

effective, and we need those hours to replenish our reservoir levels when our watering demands increase during the heat of the summer. Thank you in advance for your observance of this ordinance.

As you travel around the City this summer,

please be aware that culinary water lines will be replaced on the following streets: Center Street from 400 East to 750 East; 600 East from Center Street to Medical Drive; 1950 South from 200 to 50 West: Bountiful Boulevard from Mueller Park Rd to Deer Run Circle.

#### WE ALL LIVE DOWNSTREAM!

torm water is rain that flows from rooftops, yards, driveways, etc. into gutters and drains. As it flows it picks up dirt, grass clippings, pesticides, or other materials that are in its path. These pollutants can be carried by the storm water through Bountiful City gutters and drains into local streams and wetlands of the Great Salt

Lake - untreated. Remember to help keep pollutants from getting into our streams by not putting trash, dirt or other yard waste into the gutters. Only rain water should go down the drain!

The following substances should never be placed in the gutter or washed into a storm drain:

- Automotive Fluids (Antifreeze, Oil, Gas)
- Fertilizer, Weed Killer, Insecticides

- Landscape materials (Dirt, Grass, Bark)
- Paint

(Patriotic/Broadway)

- Pet waste
- Solvents or Cleaners

Placing any other materials into the gutters or drains is prohibited. Gutters should be cleaned by collecting any litter or debris and placing it in a garbage container. Do not sweep or wash litter or debris or any material "down-

stream" or into a storm drain inlet. Any washing of prohibited materials down the gutter and into the storm drain should be report-

ed by calling the Davis County Environmental Health Division at 801-525-5100.

### **BOUNTIFUL HANDCART DAYS**

t's almost been 168 years since the pioneers walked into the Salt Lake Valley, and again our community will celebrate their arrival at Bountiful Handcart Days. Handcart Days is a community celebration for all of us. This year's theme is "Heroes in Our Past - Faith in Our Future".

The celebration begins Thursday, July 23<sup>rd</sup>, with park activities at the Bountiful City Park (400 North and 200 West)

beginning at noon. The Grand Parade starts Thursday at 6:00 p.m. with Grand Marshall Betty Holmes, 82 years young, leading the way. In the 1970s, Betty started the pilot program for what is now pilot program for what is now known as the Special Needs Mutual. Fireworks light up the sky Thursday night about 10:00 p.m. at Mueller Park Junior High, and park activi-ties begin again Friday, July 24<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m.

In addition to food and games that can be purchased with tickets, there are many pioneer games and activities that are free, including high-quality entertainment both days. On Thursday night there will be a live band and caller for a dance under the canopy in the Bountiful City
