MAYOR'S CORNER - BOUNTIFUL BY THE NUMBERS

We've had a great summer of celebrations and we want to extend our thanks to Bountiful citizens for their concern and common sense in using fireworks. We were able to avoid

any major incidents or problems! Each day I am amazed at all the things Bountiful City has to offer and provides its citizens that are often taken for granted. When I have the chance to meet with people in our community, and in particular Boy Scout groups, I ask them to think about the things in their lives the city and its employees provide for them everyday. After some thought, they start listing many of those things . . . electricity, running water, roads, parks, police and fire protection, gutters and drains, etc.

Bountiful City is made up of 14 square miles and has a popu-

lation of 42,552. There are 159 total miles of streets with 2,151 streets lights providing illumination for those streets. Here are some other interesting numbers (statistics for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011– Source: Bountiful City CAFR):

- There are 165 full time Bountiful City employees, and many part time and seasonal employees as well.
- Bountiful has one police station and two fire stations (South Davis Metro Fire).
- There are 22 police patrol units.
- Bountiful citizens use an average of 3,992,000 gallons of water a day.
- There are 175 miles of water mains.
- 45,365 tons of waste were collected and landfilled, and 2,983 tons of recyclables were collected.

- There are 229 miles of Bountiful City Light and Power distribution and transmission lines.
- 282,073,618 kilowatt hours of electricity were sold.
 - In Bountiful City, there are: 13 parks
 - 10 covered picnic areas
 - 24 tennis courts
 - 5 soccer fields
 - 10 ball diamonds
 - 2 trail heads
 - 1 swimming pool (South Davis Recreation Center)
 - 1 ice rink (South Davis
 - Recreation Center) 1 library (Davis County)
 - 1 18 hole golf course
 - 1 art center

• Throughout Bountiful, there are over 100 flower beds maintained by the City.

- There are 5 members of the City Council.
- There is one Mayor.
- 10 ordinances were passed by the City Council.
- 11 resolutions were passed by the City Council.
- 57.59% of registered voters voted in the November 2010 election (compared to 36.7% in Utah, and 41.7% nationally—source: http://elections.gmu.edu/voter_turnout.htm).

On December 14, 2012, Bountiful will turn 120 years old. I'm proud to be a citizen of such a great community, and I'm sure Bountiful's first Mayor, Joseph L. Holbrook, and the 28 Mayors between us, would be too! Thank you for your contribution in making Bountiful City such a great place to live, work and play!

BOUNTIFUL CITY'S FALL CLEAN UP

Bountiful's Fall Clean Up is October 8 - 12, 2012. During that week on your regular garbage pick up day, city crews will also remove trash and refuse which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed. Limbs and trees must be cut, bundled and *tied* in five-foot lengths. Any bundles, bags or boxes must

not exceed 50 lbs. Items such as old furniture or appliances should be placed on the drive approach or park strip, not on the street or sidewalk. Please place your items out by 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day.

Also, to assist you in your cleanup, the landfill will not charge a fee to the residents of Bountiful during fall cleanup week or the following week so trash that does not comply with the above restriction can be disposed of at no charge. We can no longer accept propane tanks or tires of any kind during clean up week or at the landfill.

COMPLIANCE TO THE SPECIAL CLEANUP REGULATIONS IS MANDATORY. TRASH THAT DOES NOT MEET THE ABOVE REGULATIONS NEEDS TO BE TAKEN TO THE LANDFILL BY THE PROPERTY OWNER.

In addition, Bountiful City will be conduct-

ing a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program on Saturday, October 13, 2012, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the City's Maintenance Facility, located at 950 South and 200 West in Bountiful. See flyer in

your September utility bill for details.

BOUNTIFUL POWER REMINDERS & UPDATE

B ountiful City Light and Power (BCLP) operates a 24-hour dispatch center where we will have a real person answer as often as possible when you call us to report a power outage. However, during large power outages, such as the one after the east wind

storm last December, BCLP uses an automated phone system to handle the volume of calls more efficiently. This system uses caller ID to match your phone number to your account and address in order to identify your outage location. However, if you call from a phone number that is not listed on your account, the system will not be able to find your address during an outage.

BLCP is upgrading its current automated phone system to one that will handle many more

calls during power outages. This system works best when we have updated phone numbers from each of our customers. Please help us update your information so that we can respond faster in a power outage by calling us at 801.298.6072 faxing us at 801.298.1110 or e-mailing us at porche@bountifulutah.gov (PORCHE is the name of our automated phone system). Our phone system can use up to three phone numbers to find your account and address, and we suggest you provide us with the following information:

Your primary phone number. Generally, this page 1.

should be the one listed in the phone book. Two alternate numbers. You can use cell

phone numbers, but please notify us when these change.

arge Also, please remember that cordless wind phones do not function during a power outage, you

should not call 911 unless you have an actual emergency and keeping refrigerator and freezer doors closed as much as possible helps to preserve the food there.

On another note, BCLP's power plant project is nearing completion, as Big-D Construction finishes work on the power plant building. The center section of the old power plant was demolished and in its place a new building has been constructed to house two new gasfired turbines. We hope you will

drive by to see it!

BCLP started running the new turbines in June, just in time to cover power needs during the hot summer months. The new turbines are helping BCLP to cover peak power needs, and keep power costs lower by reducing BCLP's reliance on the open power market to cover these "summer peaks."

BCLP will soon be announcing a date for a public open house to be scheduled when the project is completed. See a photo of the new building on
