

How does Bountiful's tax rate compare with other Davis County Cities?


Based on 2017 rates, Bountiful has 2nd lowest individual tax rate of the 15 Davis County cities.

How can I comment on the proposed tax increase?

Bountiful City Council will hold a public hearing to receive comments at City Hall (790 South 100 East, Bountiful, Utah) August 7, 2018 at 7 pm.

Truth in Taxation legislation only requires a hearing when a city proposes a tax increase; however Bountiful City Council has determined to hold similar tax reviews annually moving forward as part of a proactive and judicious financial management plan.

When was Bountiful City's last tax increase?

Bountiful's last tax increase was in 2001, about 18 years ago.

How much is the proposed tax increase? How will the funds be used?

The proposed property tax increase is \$300,000:

- \$75,000 to replace revenue taken by State of Utah for homelessness
- \$225,000 to add two additional police officers and related required equipment

What will be the impact on the average homeowner? (How will it affect me?)

The proposed tax will increase the Bountiful homeowner's total tax by 1.3%, impacting the tax bill on a \$340,000 home (the average home value in Bountiful) by \$19.50 per year or \$1.63 per month.
