### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAM \*

*Bountiful residents only*

Bountiful City will be conducting a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program on Saturday, October 10, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the City's Maintenance Facility located at 950 South 200 West. Gates will close promptly at 3:00 p.m. so please plan accordingly. See the flyer in your September utility bill for details. ### HOLIDAY GARBAGE & RECYCLING PICKUP

Garbage and recycling are picked up on all holidays except for Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day. During Thanksgiving week, Thursday's garbage and recycling will be picked up on Friday and Friday's garbage and recycling will be picked up on Saturday. Christmas Day and New Year's Day fall on Fridays, so Friday's garbage and recycling pickup those two weeks will be picked up on Saturday, December 26 and Saturday, January 2, 2021. **Please place your containers out by 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day. Lids must be closed when put out for collection.**

### FALL LEAF PICK UP \*

As autumn approaches, Bountiful City crews provide the extra service of picking up leaves from your park strip until the trucks need to be made ready to plow for our winter storms. If possible, please bag your leaves so they won't be blown away or plug storm drains. There is no need to call the City to schedule a pick up unless the leaves/bags have been set out for longer than two weeks.



**\*The Fall Clean Up, Household Hazardous Waste drop off and leaf pick up are all subject to COVID-19 restrictions that may be in place at the time scheduled for these events and may be canceled.**

## Bountiful City's Fall Clean Up \*

Full clean up week is October 5-9. During that week, City crews will also remove trash and refuse which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed in addition to the regular pick up. Limbs and trees must be cut in five-foot lengths, bundled and **tyed with twine**. Each bundle, bag or box must not exceed 50 pounds. Please separate metal items from your other debris as metal recycling crews will be picking up those items. Concrete and construction materials will not be picked up curb side. All items including old furniture or appliances must be placed on the drive approach or park strip, not on the street or sidewalk. **Please note that fall clean up items will be picked up by several different clean up crews at different times or on days other than your regu-**

**lar garbage day, so all of your clean up items may not be picked up at the same time. Please have your clean up items and your garbage containers out for our crews to pick up before 7:00 a.m. on your regular garbage day. Lids must be closed when put out for collection.**

**COMPLIANCE TO THE SPECIAL CLEAN UP REGULATIONS IS MANDATORY. TRASH THAT DOES NOT MEET THE ABOVE REGULATIONS NEEDS TO BE TAKEN TO THE LANDFILL BY THE PROPERTY OWNER AND WILL NOT BE PICKED UP BY CITY STAFF.** Accordingly, these item can be taken to the landfill and disposed of at NO CHARGE FOR BOUNTIFUL RESIDENTS during clean up week and the following week (October 12-17—proof of residency is required at the land-



**Utilities Department** (utility payments, bowery/park reservations, accounts payable, treasury) is located at 150 North Main Street, Suite 101, with a 24/7 utility payment drop box outside. Direct number is 801.298.6100.

**Engineering and Planning Departments** (building permits, code enforcement, business licenses, etc.) are also located at 150 North Main Street, Suite 103. Direct phone numbers are 801.298.6125 (Engineering) or 801.298.6190 (Planning).

**Mayor, City Manager, City Attorney and City Recorder** are upstairs in the Public Safety Building (Police Department) located at 805 South Main Street—just southwest of City Hall.

**IT and HR Departments** are located in our Water Department building at 260 West 1050 South.

City Hall Hours at all locations are 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday. City Council meetings (second and fourth Tuesdays) and Planning Commission meetings (first and third Tuesdays) are held at the South Davis Metro Fire station located at 255 South 100 West. ## Water Source Protection

The Bountiful City Water Department understands the importance and value of protecting our natural resources and therefore has developed a source protection plan to maintain water quality and lessen the severity and impact of potential contamination sources within our watershed. This plan includes well head protection zones on all eight of our wells located throughout the community that enable us to monitor for potential source water contamination.



We also welcome a commitment from our customers to correctly use fertilizers and pesticides and properly dispose of oil, solvents and other hazardous materials so these chemicals and substances don't find their way into the ground water and affect water quality. Additionally, we operate and maintain a water treatment plant in Mueller Park and pay close attention to the watershed that is the source for our plant. Watersheds sustain life in many ways which is why proper watershed management and protection is vital for all communities that rely on this precious resource. Successful watershed management requires suitable land use practices and water quality preservation.

By implementing best practices to monitor, protect, and improve the quality of water and natural resources within a watershed, we can sustain its future. A copy of our source water protection plan can be obtained at our office at 260 West 1050 South in Bountiful.
