## **Bountiful City's Fall Clean Up**

Pall cleanup is October 5—9, 2015. During that week, city crews on will remove trash and refuse, which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed, on your regular garbage pickup day. Limbs and trees must be cut, bundled and *tied* in five foot lengths. Any bundles, bags or boxes must not exceed 50 pounds. Concrete and construction materials will not be picked up curb side. Items such as old furniture or appliances should be placed on the drive approach or park strip, not on the street or sidewalk. Please place your items out by 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day.

Also, to assist you in your cleanup, the landfill will not charge Bountiful Residents a fee during fall cleanup week or the following week so trash that does not comply with the above restrictions can be disposed of at no charge. Landfill fees will still be in place for concrete and construction materials during the free cleanup weeks. We do not accept propane tanks or tires of any kind during clean up week or at the landfill.

COMPLIANCE TO THE SPECIAL CLEANUP REGULATIONS IS MANDATO-RY. TRASH THAT DOES NOT MEET THE ABOVE REGULATIONS NEEDS TO BE TAKEN TO THE LANDFILL BY THE PROPERTY OWNER. In addition, Bountiful City will be conducting a **Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program** for *Bountiful residents only* on Saturday, October 10, 2015, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the City's Maintenance Facility, located at 950 South 200 West in Bountiful. See the flyer in your September utility bill for details.

And remember, garbage is picked up on all holidays except for Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day. On those three holidays your garbage pick-up will be one day delayed with Friday's route being picked up on Saturday. Again, please have your containers out by 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day.

## **Top Three Resources for Food Preservation**

The Davis County Obesity Workgroup wants to remind you to use safe food preservation practices as you preserve your food this season. To prevent your preserved food from becoming contaminated, it's important to use recipes and procedures that are scientifically studied and USDA approved. This means recipes on Pinterest or that recipe that's been passed down from generation to generation may not meet the criteria. According to USU Extension Services, the three best places for food preservation information and recipes are:

- USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning, 2009 revision
- So Easy to Preserve from the Universi-

ty of Georgia.

A current Ball Blue Book (37th edition is the most recent)

latest information on food preservation as well as webinars, how to teach youth to preserve food, how to select pressure can-
