Bountiful's Spring Clean Up

S pring cleanup is April 3—7, 2017. On your regular garbage pickup day during that week, city crews will also remove trash and refuse which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed. Limbs and trees must be cut in five-foot lengths, bundled and tied with twine. Each bundle, bag or box must not exceed 50 pounds. Concrete and construction materials will not be picked up curb side. All items, including old furniture or appliances, must be placed on the drive approach or park strip—not on the street or sidewalk. Spring cleanup items will be picked up by a special cleanup crew and may come by at a different time than the sanitation truck. Please have your cleanup items out for our crews to pick up before 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day.

Also, to assist you in your spring cleanup, the landfill will not charge Bountiful residents a fee (proof of residency required) during spring cleanup week and the following

week (through April 15), so trash that does not comply with the above re-

strictions can be disposed of at no charge. Landfill fees will still be in place for concrete and construction materials during cleanup free weeks. The landfill does not accept hazardous materials, propane tanks or tires of any kind at any time.

COMPLIANCE TO THE SPECIAL CLEANUP REGULATIONS IS MANDATO-

RY. TRASH THAT DOES NOT MEET THE ABOVE REGULATIONS WILL NEED TO BE TAKEN TO THE LANDFILL BY THE PROPERTY OWNER.

Garbage containers should be placed at the curb before 7:00 a.m. on your regular pickup day. Lids must be closed when put out for collection.

LANDFILL SUMMER HOURS start April 1 and go through October 31. The landfill is closed on Sundays & holidays. Hours are Monday through Saturday from 8:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. Vehicles must be out by closing, so please plan accordingly. Please separate and place recyclable items in proper areas at the landfill.

Compost, which increases water retention in your soil, is now available at the landfill for spring gardening and is priced at \$35.00 per ton.

Cross Connection/Backflow Information

It is a violation of State Law to interconnect culinary and secondary water supplies. As you work with your sprinkler systems this spring, remember to avoid any form of cross connection. Allowing unsanitary secondary water to backflow into the culinary water system will result in the contamination of the public water supply.

A **cross connection** is any actual or potential arrangement between a public or consumer's culinary water system and any other source or system that may potentially introduce chemicals, fertilizers or untreated water into the potable water system. Here are some examples of how cross connection/backflow can happen:

Backpressure happens when the pressure of the contaminant source exceeds the positive pressure in the water distribu-

tion main. An example of backpressure contamination is when a drinking water supply main has a connection to a hot water boiler system that is not protected by an approved and functioning backflow preventer. If pressure in the boiler system increases to

where it exceeds the pressure in the water distribution system, backflow from the boiler to the drinking water supply system may occur. **Backsiphonage** is caused by a negative pressure (vacuum or partial vacu-

um) in the water distribution system. This situation is similar in effect to the sipping of water through a straw. Negative pressure in the drinking water distribution system can happen because of a water main break or when a hydrant is flushed or used for firefighting.

ing during Handcart Days in July. Come support our new Bountiful Museum.






