Main Street Paving Begins

As early as Wednesday, June 12th, crews will begin to remove and replace the top layer of asphalt to preserve the life of the road and provide a smoother driving surface. It will take approximately two weeks to complete this process.

During that time, residents can expect some night time work as crews pave. There will also be one-way flagging operations to accommodate the work. Crews will “race track” the work, starting at the south end and moving north in the outside lane, then turn back to the south in the outside lane.

Drivers can expect traffic delays and short-term side street and access closures. Driveways will be inaccessible for about 20 minutes at a time while the paving equipment passes.

Additional work that will also take place over the next week includes:

- Crews will continue to remove and replace pedestrian ramps along Main Street.
- Temporary closures at 470 North and Center Street intersections to reconstruct the sidestreets.

** Construction schedules are weather dependent and subject to change.*

Project Overview

Construction will extend on SR-106 (Main Street) from 400 North in Bountiful to 1700 South in Farmington. This project will rehabilitate the pavement by replacing the top layer of asphalt to preserve the life of the road and provide a smoother driving surface for the public. The project will also reconstruct ADA pedestrian ramps, replace roadway signs, and complete spot repairs on the sidewalks. In addition, sections at the north end of Main Street will be restriped to add left turn lanes at Jennings Lane, 1450 North, and 1350 North. The project will also narrow lane widths on SR-106 to better accommodate bicycles in the shoulders.

Construction is anticipated to last through early August 2019.
