SDMF Wildfire Preparedness Reminder



Recent wildfires in California have many wondering—could that happen here? The answer is yes. Our east bench faces significant wildfire risk, and one of the best defenses is proactive property maintenance.

The infographic below, courtesy of CalFire, outlines key steps to create defensible space around your home. Focusing on two zones—0–30 feet (Zone 1) and 30–100 feet (Zone 2)—can make a major difference. Even addressing just Zone 1 significantly improves your home's defensibility.

Zone 1 (0–30 feet):

- Remove dead plants, grass, brush, and weeds.
- Clear dead leaves and pine needles from your yard, roof valleys, and gutters. Install 1/8" ember-proof metal mesh over attic and roof vents.
- Keep tree branches at least 10 feet from structures, chimneys, and other trees.

Zone 2 (30–100 feet):

- Maintain a green zone of grass; cut annual grasses to 4 inches or less.
- Space shrubs and trees to prevent flames from spreading horizontally.
- Trim tree limbs up 6 feet to block flames from climbing vertically.
- Use caution with lawn equipment—avoid mowing or edging on hot, windy days.

By following these simple guidelines, you'll help protect your home—and your neighborhood—from wildfire.
