Snow Plowing Facts!

City employees and elected officials often hear compliments on the way Bountiful City streets are plowed after a snow storm by the Streets and Sanitation crews. Here are some interesting facts about how plowing works in Bountiful City, how long it takes and how much salt is used.

Plows start plowing when snow turns the roads white. There are 23 routes in the City and each route takes two hours to complete once the snow stops, in addition to the plowing time during the storm. Crews plow uphill first. TIP: If you get stuck driving up a hill, wait for a plow to pass, back up into the plow's trail and then continue up the hill.

Bountiful's main streets such as Orchard Drive, 1800 South, Davis and Bountiful Boulevards are plowed first. Next are streets that go *through* subdivisions such as Millbrook, Vineyard and 2200 South. Then all residential roads.

So far this winter (October 23 to December 20, 2022), the Streets Department has used 9,808 tons of salt, plowed for a total of 1735.25 hours (the longest shift has been 21 hours) and used 7349.5 gallons of fuel. Another 544 tons of salt (16 belly dump truckloads) were delivered on December 19 to the City's salt shed located behind the Streets Department Building on 200 West (pictured below).



The City's plow trucks hold 12 tons of salt. The average baby elephant weighs 200 pounds,



so that would be equivalent to the weight of 120 baby elephants!!

Residents can help our plow drivers keep City streets and sidewalks safe by:

1. Not parking on the streets between 2:00 and 6:00 a.m. through March 31 and/or



during a storm. 2. Keeping the plowed streets clear by not blowing or shoveling snow into them - this is prohibited by ordinance.

3. Clearing sidewalks within 24 hours after the snow stops.

Flood Hazard Information

Flood insurance is required for properties

located in "Special Flood Hazard Areas" which have a 1% or greater change of flooding in

any given year. Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) can be viewed on the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)'s Map Service Center. You can find a Map Service Center link on the Engineering Department page on the City's website.

Recycling - Tips

In December, Bountiful City took over picking up recycling for the City. The schedule and the carts are still the same. The only difference will be that Bountiful City trucks will be doing the picking up!

Along with the new 2023 recycling calendar, you can find helpful tips on what can and can't be recycled and other FAQs on our website. For example:

- Did you know that plastic bags should not be put in your recycling can? Plastic bags gum up the recycling sorting machines. Most grocery stores have recepticles for plastic bags.
- Did you know you can leave the lids on plastic bottles and jugs? The lid is too small to recycle by itself, so leaving it on is best!
