Mayor's Corner: Budget

The City Council and I have been meeting with Bountiful City's management and staff over the last few months to prepare the City's budget for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 which begins on July 1, 2016, and ends on June 30, 2017.

Each City department has provided to us a narrative explanation and supporting quantitative data for their proposed budgets and services in alignment with stated Council Policy Priorities which state what is important to the City of Bountiful (see page 9 of our current Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Adopted Budget on our website for more details).

By state law, the annual budget must be balanced as to revenues and expenditures/ expenses and be adopted in accordance with the Utah Fiscal Procedures Act by June 22 annually.

The overall budget process is guided by a collaborative effort of your elected officials and City staff under a continuing shared goal of keeping Bountiful City financially stable, balanced, and diverse both now and in the future. Listed below are some key dates to be aware of in May and June related to the budget. In addition, a public notice related to an annually budgeted transfer from the Light and Power Fund to the General Fund of the City is included in your utility bill for your information.

Home Safety Reminders

S moke alarms save lives!! Having a working smoke alarm in your home doubles the chance of surviving a reported fire. Nearly two-thirds of home fire deaths are in homes with no or nonworking smoke alarms.

Here's what you should know:

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area and on every level of your home.
- Test your smoke alarms monthly.
- Replace all smoke alarms in your home every 10 years.

Carbon monoxide

Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas created when fuels such as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil, and methane burn incompletely. In the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel, and vehicles or generators running in an attached garage can produce dangerous levels of carbon monox-

Here's what you should know:

- The dangers of CO exposure depend on a number of variables, including the victim's health, age and activity
- A person can be poisoned by a small amount of CO over a longer period of time or by a large amount of CO over a shorter period of time.
- CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home.
- When a smoke or carbon monoxide alarm sounds, call 9-1-1 and get and stay outside. Source: NFPA
