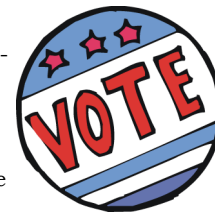

2017 Municipal Election

Bountiful City will have an election in 2017. Candidates for Mayor and two City Council seats will be on the ballot. If necessary, a Primary Election will be held on August 15, and the General Election will be held on November 7.

All voting will be done by mail in this election. Ballots will be mailed to all registered voters in Bountiful 21 days before Election Day. If you need to register to vote or you do not receive a ballot in the mail prior to the election(s), please contact the Davis County Clerk's office at 801.451.3508. There will be a vote center in the South Davis Branch Library on Election Day as well as a ballot box in the Mayor's office at City Hall until the Monday before the election. If you are interested in learning more about the election or even becoming a candidate, contact the Bountiful City Recorder at 801.298.6142. Informational packets for potential candidates are available from the Recorder's office as well. The candidate filing period is June 1-7, 8:00 a.m.– 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Every March our community partners with local Boy Scouts on the Scouting for Food Drive.
