WINTER PARKING ORDINANCE & SNOW REMOVAL



Overnight parking on Bountiful City streets is prohibited from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m., November 1 – March 31, so our snowplow crews can safely and efficiently clear the roads.

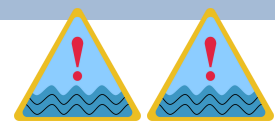

FLOOD HAZARD INFORMATION



The US Congress requires all federally insured lenders to mandate flood insurance on properties located in "Special Flood Hazard Areas," which have a 1% or greater chance of flooding in any year. FEMA issues Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) to determine flood risks for properties. FIRMs can be viewed online at FEMA's Map Service Center:

The Bountiful City Engineering Department can assist with flood insurance and flood information for specific properties, including flood zone, "floodway" status, flood depth (where available), flood hazards, natural floodplain functions, historic flood information, and flood protection measures. Staff can also do site visits and offer flood protection recommendations. Copies of FEMA Elevation Certificates and a brochure about Utah floods are available.
