

OFFICIAL NOTICE

Due to persistent drought conditions, Bountiful City has implemented **watering restrictions** for areas that do not have secondary water service. The restrictions apply specifically to outdoor water use of culinary water. Your cooperation may reduce the need for additional restrictions this summer.

Outdoor use of culinary water is **prohibited** prior to May 15, 2026 and after Sept. 15, 2026 to match restrictions for areas with secondary water service.

FROM May 15 to Sept. 15, 2026 :

- WATERING IS LIMITED TO **3** CYCLES A WEEK PER PROPERTY
 - Those with **EVEN** address numbers may water on **MONDAY, THURSDAY AND SATURDAY.**
 - Those with **ODD** address numbers may water on **TUESDAY, FRIDAY AND SUNDAY.**
- Zone run times are limited to 20 minutes for spray heads & 40 minutes for rotor heads.
- **NO WATERING ALLOWED ON WEDNESDAYS**
- **NO WATERING BETWEEN 10:00 am AND 6:00 pm**
- **OTHER RESTRICTIONS ALSO APPLY**

Enforcement and penalties:

- 1st Offense** – WRITTEN WARNING
- 2nd Offense** – \$100 FINE added to utility bill
- 3rd Offense** – \$250 FINE added to utility bill
- 4th Offense** – \$500 FINE added to utility bill
- 5th Offense** – Culinary Service terminated pending payment of \$1,000 FINE & OTHER FEES

Enforcement and penalties:

- 1st Offense** – WRITTEN WARNING
- 2nd Offense** – \$100 FINE added to utility bill
- 3rd Offense** – \$250 FINE added to utility bill
- 4th Offense** – \$500 FINE added to utility bill
- 5th Offense** – Culinary Service terminated pending payment of \$1,000 FINE & OTHER FEES



DROUGHT CONDITIONS

Bountiful, like the majority of the state, is experiencing drought conditions. Please consider how you can use water efficiently and conserve whenever possible.

HERE ARE A FEW WAYS **YOU** CAN HELP:

Outdoors

- **Install a “smart controller” for irrigation systems.**
- **Adjust your watering to match your soil type.**
- **Prioritize your watering.** 1st trees, 2nd shrubs, 3rd flowers, and lastly, grass. Grass is resilient during times of drought and will bounce back.
- **Raise your mower.** Raise your mower height to 3 to 4 inches. Taller grass means deeper roots.
- **Turn off sprinklers during a rain storm.**

Indoors

- **Water plants using the water from cooked pasta or vegetables,** the extra nutrients help plants grow.
- **Do large loads in washing machines and dishwashers.** Large loads maximize water usage.
- **Shower shorter and smarter.** Showering just 1 minute less will save up to 1,875 gallons of water each year. Replacing old showerhead can cut your water use in half.
