In 2014, the event was broadcast nationally and internationally into over 100 million households, and 275,000 spectators watched the event in person generating \$20m in direct economic impact for Utah.

Tour officials will be looking for volunteers as the date gets closer - we will keep you updated as we get more information, which will

be included in our May newsletter and on our website. This is a great opportunity for Bountiful City to "strut its stuff" and share our great community with visitors from all over. We hope Bountiful citizens will be well represented lining the streets cheering the race participants along! # Bountiful City's Spring Clean Up

Spring cleanup is April 13 through 17. During that week on your regular garbage pickup day, City crews will also remove trash and refuse which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed. Limbs and trees must be cut, bundled and tied in 5-foot

lengths. Each bundle, bag or box must not exceed 50 lbs. Concrete and construction materials will not be picked up curb side. All items including old furniture or appliances must be placed on the drive approach or park strip, not in the street or on the sidewalk. Please have your clean up items out for pick up by 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day.

Also, to assist you in your spring cleanup, the landfill will not charge a fee to Bountiful residents during spring cleanup week or the following week so trash that does not comply with the above restrictions can be disposed of at no charge. Landfill fees will still be in place for concrete and construction materials during clean up weeks. We do not accept propane tanks or tires of any kind during the clean up week or at the landfill.

COMPLIANCE TO THE SPECIAL CLEANUP REGULATIONS IS MANDATORY. TRASH THAT DOES NOT MEET THE ABOVE REGULATIONS WILL NEED TO BE TAKEN TO THE LANDFILL BY THE PROPERTY OWNER.

GARBAGE CONTAINERS SHOULD BE PLACED AT THE CURB NO LATER THAN 7:00 A.M. ON YOUR REGULAR PICKUP DAY. LIDS MUST BE CLOSED WHEN PUT OUT FOR COLLECTION.

#### **Bountiful City Wins Award**

Bountiful City, along with their contractors, were recently awarded the 2014 Award of Excellence by the Associated General Contractors of Utah in the Highway/Municipal Utilities Division. This prestigious award is for the Bountiful 400 East reconstruction project from Pages Lane to 1130 North.

"We worked hard to make the project fit the neighborhood," said Lloyd Cheney, Assistant City Engineer. The project team took into consideration the slope of the street, and designed the project to make it easier for residents to get in and out of their driveways without damaging their vehicles. The project also included an upgrade to the culinary water system, and coordinated the replacement of the

irrigation and gas systems by other utility provid-

ers. The new concrete pavement will require less maintenance and be more durable than the old asphalt surface. Centerville City also benefitted from the project by funding construction for the portion of the roadway from the Bountiful/Centerville border to the intersection at Pages Lane. The summer of 2015 will see the continuation of this project along 400 East from 1130 North to 400 North.

The judging criteria for the award includes: Overcoming Challenges and Teamwork, Safety, Innovation and Contribution to the Community, Construction Quality and Craftsmanship, and Function and Aesthetic Quality of the Design.

#### Deer Program Update

he Department of Wildlife Resources (DWR), in conjunction with Bountiful City, has been working on reducing the mule deer population in the City by relocating deer that are being trapped on both residential and public properties within City limits.

With the abundance of gardens and other edible vegetation around Bountiful, the deer are now staying down in the City year round as opposed to returning to their more natural habitat areas in the surrounding hills and mountains during warmer months. This poses several safety and sanitary issues on City streets as well as in private yards and other open spaces.

In order to get the deer back into a more suitable environment, the DWR has enlisted the help of volunteers and others to remove deer from the traps and transport them to other parts of the state. As of the middle of January, 118 deer had been trapped and removed from Bountiful with approximately 17 traps.


