Bountiful City's Fall Clean Up

all clean up week is October 7-11. During that week on your regular garbage pickup day, City crews will also remove trash and refuse which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed in addition to the regular pick up. Limbs and trees must be cut in five foot lengths, bundled and tied with twine. Each bundle, bag or box must not exceed 50 pounds. Please separate metal items from your other debris as metal recycling crews will be picking up those items. Concrete and construction materials will not be picked up curb side. All items including old furniture or appliances must be placed on the drive approach or park strip, not on the street or sidewalk. Fall clean up items will be picked up by several special clean up crews which may come at different times

or days than your regular garbage collection. Different crews will be picking up different types of items. All of your clean up items may not be picked up at the same time. Please have your clean up items out for our crews to pick up before 7:00 a.m. on your regular garbage day.

Fall 2019 CERT Class Dates

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program teaches people to assist others following a disaster when

professional responders are not available. Topics include: Disaster Awareness, Search and Rescue, Treating Victims, Triage, Saving Lives, Transporting Victims, CERT Organization, Damage Assessment, Incident Command, Fire Suppression, Hazardous Materials, Terrorism Awareness, Medical Skills, Disaster Psychology and Communica-



tions. The eight-week class offers classroom instruction, skills practice and a mock disaster. The class is held on Thursday evenings beginning August 29,

from 6:30—9:30 p.m. The mock disaster will be on Saturday, October 26 from 9:00 a.m. until noon. The cost is \$40 which includes instruction, training materials, CERT book, CERT hard hat, CERT vest, gloves, backpack, flashlight, pry bar, caution tape and more.

HOLIDAY GARBAGE & RECYCLING PICKUP

Garbage and recycling are picked up on all holidays except for Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day. On Thanksgiving, Thursday's garbage will be picked up on Friday and Friday's garbage will be picked up on Saturday. The Christmas and New Year's holidays fall on Wednesday in 2019, so garbage and recycling pickup will be picked up on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve (Tuesdays) and then delayed by one day the rest of that week starting with Wednesday's pick up which will be picked up on Thursday, Thursday on Friday, and Friday on Saturday. Please place your cans out by 7:00

Please place your cans out by 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day. Lids must be closed when put out for collection.

FALL LEAF PICK UP

As autumn approaches, Bountiful City crews will be looking for leaves to pick up from your park strip. If possible, please bag your leaves so they won't be blown away. There is

no need to call the City to schedule a pick up unless the leaves/bags have been



set out for a week or more. This is an extra service the City provides until the trucks need to be made ready to plow for our winter storms.

Utilities Department (utility payments, bowery/park reservations, accounts payable, treasury) are located at 150 North Main Street, Suite 101. There is a 24/7 utility payment drop box outside those offices as well. Direct number is 801.298.6100.

Engineering and Planning Departments (building permits, code enforcement, business licenses, etc.) are located at 150 North Main Street, Suite 103. Direct phone numbers are 801.298.6125 (Engineering) or 801.298.6190 (Planning).

Mayor, City Manager, City Attorney and City Recorder are upstairs in the Public Safety Building located at 805 South Main Street—just southwest of City Hall.

IT and HR Departments are now located in our Water Department building at 260 West 1050 South.

Hours for the employees at these different locations are the same— 7:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday. City Council meetings (second and fourth Tuesdays) and Planning Commission meetings (first and third Tuesdays) are held at the South Davis Metro Fire station located at 255 South 100 West.
