



WINTER PARKING "It is unlawful for any person who owns or has possession, custody, or control of any vehicle to to your property within 24 hours after a snow park or allow to be parked any vehicle

or trailer on any street between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. during the months of November. December, January, February, and March." The ordinance also prohibits parking vehicles on the street when it is actually snowing, or within twelve hours

thereafter, except on Main Street between 400 North and 500 South.





Update on 138 Substation Upgrade
