HOLIDAY GARBAGE COLLECTION:

Garbage and recycling are picked up on all holidays except Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Years Day, and pick up is delayed by one day the rest of the week with Friday routes being picked up on Saturday.

ADUs - an affordable housing option

ADUs can generate rental income to help homeowners cover mortgage payments or simply make ends meet. The income provided by an ADU tenant can be especially important for older people on fixed incomes. Although market-rate rents for ADUs tend to be slightly more than for similarly sized apartments, they often represent the only affordable rental choices in single-family neighborhoods, which typically contain no studio or one-bedroom housing options at all.

Big houses are being built, small houses are needed

Do we really need more than three times as much living space per person as we did in 1950? Can we afford to buy or rent, heat, cool and care for such large homes?

Year	1950	2017
Average square footage of new single-family homes	983	2,571
Number of people per household	3.8	2.5
Square feet of living space per person	292	1,012

Fact: ADUs house more people per square foot of living area than single-family homes do
